With short connecting flights from London, Manchester and Birmingham alongside codeshare arrangements with KLM via Amsterdam to their worldwide network, Aer Lingus via Dublin to USA and Canada, Etihad via Manchester to the Middle East and Cathy Pacific via Manchester to Asia and an airport just 15 minutes from the city centre, getting here could not be easier. There are also good rail links to Glasgow, Edinburgh, Aberdeen, London and the rest of the UK.

From an incentive programme for 20 to a conference for 800 Inverness Loch Ness has all you need.



Inverness - The Capital of the Highlands

No visit to the Highlands of Scotland would be complete without a stay in Inverness, aptly called the capital of the Highlands. Inverness is a Gaelic word meaning "mouth of the River Ness", which flows out of Loch Ness into the Moray Firth.

Inverness is a city with a rich variety of places to visit and things to do both in and around the city. The city boasts a host of historic buildings, notably in the Old Town and from the Victorian Market to the award-winning Eastgate centre.

Inverness Castle and St Andrew's Cathedral overlook the River Ness and one of the most beautiful riverside settings in Britain.

From the castle along the river and through the Ness Islands you can watch anglers casting long lines to leaping Atlantic salmon.

Host to many events and festivals, explore the art, history and heritage of the Highlands at Inverness Museum & Art Gallery or relax in the tropical gardens at Inverness Botanic Gardens - or why not take an open-topped bus ride round the city or a cruise down the Caledonian Canal to world famous Loch Ness.





Loch Ness

22.5 miles long, a mile wide and 700 feet at its deepest, Loch Ness is the largest lake in Scotland by volume. The surrounding area is filled with historic attractions, natural wonders, cosy places to stay, and superb eateries. The Loch Ness Monster is just one of the many myths and legends to be discovered in this particularly beautiful part of Scotland.

Loch Ness is full of surprises! You can sit back and enjoy the landscape, explore the history of the area, visit the charming towns and villages like Fort Augustus, Foyers, Cannich, and Drumnadrochit, or just relax and enjoy the great outdoors. Take a leisurely walk along the shore or a bigger challenge like the South Loch Ness Trail or the 70 mile long Great Glen Way which traverses some of Scotland's finest scenery, it is all here just waiting to be discovered by you.



Diverse Landscapes
From Loch's to snowcapped mountains,

Glen's that offers a unique combination of mountain scenery, ancient Caledonian forests, rivers and impressive waterfalls. In particular, Glen Affric has earned a reputation as one of the most beautiful wilderness areas of Scotland and it is now a national nature reserve.

Great Outdoors

To experience the area you must spend time exploring the great outdoors and for that there is no better place to be.

For runners, walkers or cyclists we have a vast array of established trails available to satisfy all ability levels.

For lovers of wildlife there are numerous options, the Highlands of Scotland has a richly deserved reputation for wildlife. The area is abundant with animals in the wild, including deer, pine martens, otters and even wildcats. From red squirrel to bottlenose dolphins, there is a fascinating diversity of creatures to enjoy in their natural habitat.

The region contains an array of internationally important bird including ospreys, red kites and white tailed sea eagles. It is also home to game birds such as the black grouse, red grouse, ptarmigan and capercaillie, and at least a quarter of the UK's threatened species including the majestic golden eagle.

The area is steep

The area is steeped in history, from prehistoric settlements to castle ruins.

Just outside Inverness, the moorland of Culloden is where the hopes of Prince Charles Edward Stuart and the Jacobite army ended in 1746, the last battle fought on British soil.

Castles include atmospheric Urquhart Castle, perched above Loch Ness, the magnificent Dunrobin Castle and the 14th century Cawdor Castle, home to the present Cawdor family and famously linked with the Shakespearian play Macbeth.

If you're feeling more energetic, there are plenty of adventure sports on offer in the area such as wind surfing, paragliding and skiing on the Cairnqorms as well as the Nevis Range.

And of course, remember Scotland is the home of golf, so don't forget to pack your clubs.





Cawdor Castle

A fairy-tale castle which you can touch and see and sense for yourself, Cawdor is a splendid house and home to the Dowager Countess Cawdor. With its low doorways, turnpike stairs, massive walls warmed by rare tapestries and its original kitchen, Cawdor is a place where you can slip right into Scottish History.

Cawdor's three outstanding gardens are not to be missed. They include herbaceous borders, roses, rhododendrons, the rare blue poppy, spring bulbs contemporary sculptures and a wild garden. In Cawdor Big Wood are splendid trees and nature trails. On certain days walk to nearby Auchindoune House to explore the Tibetan, formal and vegetable gardens as well as an orchard and arboretum.

There are three shops, the gift shop, highland shop, the Courtyard Restaurant and Clubhouse Coffee shop offer a selection of home baking and meals prepared by the Cawdor Chefs from the finest local ingredients.

The Courtvard Restaurant is available during the summer season in the evening for events up to 50 quests. Outside the summer season the restaurant is available during the day and the evening. In addition to the restaurant there is also space accommodate marquees for up to 600 guests.



Craigmonie Centre

This community centre is integrated with Glen Urquhart High School in Drumnadrochit, only 14 miles from Inverness on the A82 by Loch Ness. With a range of youth activities, adult education and a quality arts programme there is something for everyone.

The facilities Include a 200 seat theatre with comfortable retractable, tiered seating, HD Projector, Blueray, DVD & VHS, a large cinema screen for forward projection - rear projection and stage sets by arrangement, surround sound and PA system, professional lighting rig and curtains.

There are various meeting rooms that can accommodate from 10 to 80 delegates. A multi gymnasium and sports hall – for a range of indoor activities, all weather floodlit pitch, grass playing fields, fitness suite and changing facilities. In addition - there is a café, library, dining area, gallery area and courtyard.

Within the boundary walls was accommodation for a governor, officers, and artillery detachment and a 1,600 strong infantry garrison. It also housed more than 80 guns, a magazine for 2,500 gunpowder barrels, ordnance and provision stores, a brewhouse and a chapel.

The Archive Centre

The Highland Archive Centre is responsible for collecting and preserving the historic record of the Highlands. The archives date from the 14th century to the present day and consist of original documents in different formats from charters, minutes, correspondence and accounts to maps, photographs and films.

The Centre is the only venue in the Highlands with access to ScotandsPeople Network, providing access to a wealth of historic records from across the whole of Scotland including Census Returns from 1841 to 1911; Old Parish Registers up to 1854; and Births, Marriages and Deaths (from January 1855).

The Highland Archive Centre is open to all and knowledgeable staff are always on hand to assist you. One to one consultations with family history staff are available to book every day, and they can help you to research your family history, with access to Scottish, English and Welsh Civil Registration records and many other types of online resources.

Town House

Built in the Flemish-Baronial style on the corner of Castle Street and High Street in Inverness city centre, the Town House was constructed in 1878-82 to the design of local architect William Lawrie as a larger version of Sir George Gilbert Scott's Albert Institute in Dundee.

This building replaced the Old Town House, which was built in 1708 as the Inverness home of Lord Lovat, became the Burgh Town House in 1716 and was demolished in 1878.

The interior is grand, with an imposing staircase rising from the entrance to access the principal rooms: the sizeable Town Hall, the Council Chamber and a committee room. The wood-panelled Council Chamber features fine stainedglass windows and grand chandeliers. This was used for a historic meeting of the British Cabinet, the first and only occasion it had met outside London until the practice was re-introduced in 2008.

The Town House served as the base for Inverness Town Council until the 1960s. It remains in use for meetings, civic functions, concerts and civil marriages.





Currency

The currency in the United Kingdom is the Great British Pound.

Scottish banks issue their own bank notes but they have exactly the same value as those issued by the Bank of England and they are legal tender in all parts of mainland UK. Most hotels, restaurants and shops accept all major credit cards and cash machines are located throughout the city.

There are no set rules about tipping in the UK, but it is normal to tip about 10% of the total bill in restaurants and cafes. Some establishments add a service charge on top of the bill as standard so you may wish to check before leaving a further gratuity. It is not common practice to tip bar staff in clubs and pubs unless you are eating there. You would normally tip taxidrivers by rounding up to the nearest pound (£).

All prices in the UK include VAT at 20%. Visitors from outside the EU may not need to pay VAT on all purchases and there are some stores that operate a VAT refund system.

Electricity

British electrical standards are 50Hz 230 volts, so some North American and European electrical devices may require converters. All will require pluq adapters.

Health

There are no vaccinations required or recommended for entry into the UK.

Medical Treatment

European Union citizens are entitled to free medical treatment at National Health Service (NHS) hospitals, which can be made quicker and easier on production of a European Health Insurance Card (EHIC card). The card is not, however a replacement for insurance.

Australia, New Zealand and several non-EU European countries have reciprocal healthcare arrangements with the UK.

Citizens of other countries will be charged for most medical services with some exclusions including emergency treatment.

You should obtain travel insurance with medical cover before your trip.

Doctors' surgeries are usually open during the working day from 9am to 5pm, and some have late surgeries in the evening. Outside of surgery hours, you can visit the nearest hospital which has an accident and emergency or minor injury department for complaints that require immediate attention.

Pharmacists can dispense only a limited range of drugs without a doctor's prescription. Most are open standard shop hours, though in large towns some may close as late as 10pm. Local newspapers often carry lists of late-opening pharmacies, or you can call the NHS inform Helpline on **0800 22 44 88** or visit the NHS 24 website.

For non-urgent emergencies such as car theft, damage to property, a minor traffic collision etc. please call **101**.

Smoking

Since April 2006, there has been a ban on smoking in all enclosed public places throughout Scotland.

Visas

For information on visa entry requirements to the UK please visit the Foreign and Commonwealth Office website.

You will require a visa to come to the UK for a business visit of up to six months if you are a citizen of one of the countries that currently require a visa to enter the UK.

You can also apply for a visa up to 3 months before your date of travel at visa sections of UK embassies, high commissions and consulates and through visa application centres around the world.

Driving

You can drive on any full foreign driving licence for up to 12 months but after that you will need a full UK driving licence. The UK Driving Test includes both practical and theory tests.

In the UK, cars drive on the left side of the road.

The National Speed Limit is 60mph (98km/h) on single-carriageway roads and 70mph (112km/h) on dual-carriageways and motorways.

Built-up areas have a standard 30mph (48km/h) limit in force, though in some areas (near schools, housing estates etc), it drops to 20mph.

Driving under the influence of alcohol is taken very seriously in Scotland and the UK and there can be heavy penalties for those found to be above the legal blood/alcohol limit. As of 5 December 2014, the legal limit has been lowered to 50 mg of alcohol in 100 ml of blood (from 80 mg of alcohol).

It is illegal to use a hand-held phone, or similar device, when driving a vehicle in Scotland and the UK.


Inverness Airport is located some 7 miles east of Inverness, 21 miles from Loch Ness.

Direct flights to Inverness from Flybe, Easyjet and British Airways (May 2016) are available to and from London Heathrow, London Gatwick, Luton, Amsterdam, Belfast, Bristol, Birmingham, Dublin and Manchester, with Summer arrivals from Jersey and Zurich, and weekly Geneva and Innsbruck flights in the winter season.

The airport is also used to handling all aspects of charter flights and business aviation with full handling services available.

The A9 is the main access road to Inverness from the South, Perth, Edinburgh and Glasgow and points further afield.
